## A LONG TIME AGO IN A COUNTRY FAR. FAR AWAY...

Right in the middle of the Christmas story is a baby called Jesus. He grew up to be a man whose life changed history. Four different people wrote about Jesus' life. They were called Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. Their stories of Jesus' life are called 'The Four Gospels.' Gospel just means 'Good News' and we could all do with some good news this year! So read on...

#### HELPING YOU EXPLORE THE STORY ...

You can follow the 'Search for the Star' trail anytime from Saturday 12<sup>th</sup> December until Christmas Eve. Just follow the map on the back cover and visit each scene in order. Remember to 'Be bright and be seen' at all times. The trail should take you about an hour and a half to complete

Use your mobile device to scan the QR code at each location and then:

- Read the short piece from the Bible and the reflection out loud.
- Think about the questions on your own or as a household group.
- Write down any thoughts you have.
- Listen to the Christmas carol that links to the scene.

#### THE ANGEL'S VISIT TO MARY

Luke chapter I, verses 26-33

#### Reflection:

There was nothing special about Mary. She was probably only a teenager when the angel came to visit her. God had chosen this very ordinary girl for an extraordinary role – to be the Mother of God's own Son. When the angel Gabriel came to her, she was afraid (which is probably not surprising), but the angel says, "The Lord is with you."

Questions to explore:
I. What makes you afraid?
2. If you imagine God with you, does that make you more or less afraid?
3. What does that tell you about your picture of God?

#### JOSEPH'S DREAM

Matthew chapter, I verses 18-21

#### Reflection:

Sometimes we focus on Mary and the baby Jesus so much that we forget about Joseph in the Christmas story. Matthew's gospel tells us that Joseph "was a righteous man." Being 'righteous' is another way of saying he was a kind and honest man – he tried to live right. We can see this in the way that Joseph wanted to make sure Mary was not treated unkindly when people found out she was pregnant before she and Joseph got married (a big deal back then).

Questions to explore:
<ol> <li>In what ways do you treat other people that is kind and honest?</li> <li>Are there times when you find yourself doing the opposite?</li> <li>How does it make you feel when other people are kind to you?</li> </ol>

#### THE JOURNEY TO BETHLEHEM

Luke chapter 2, verses 1-5

#### Reflection:

Caesar Augustus was the first Roman Emperor and the founder of the great Roman Empire, but he only plays a very small part in the Christmas story. He is not the real 'star,' or even one of the main characters. Mary and Joseph, a young unknown couple from the small town of Nazareth, are suddenly about to become two of the biggest names in the greatest story in human history. God has an exciting plan for each and every human being - people just like you!

Questions	to	explore:
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
I. How would it make you feel to know that God has an exciting plan for your life? 2. Are you ready for an adventure with God?



#### THE BABY IS BORN

Luke chapter 2, verses 6-7

#### Reflection:

The angel told Mary and Joseph that the baby would be the "Son of the Most High," God's own Son. When Jesus was born there was no room for them at the inn, so his Mother Mary laid him in a manger – an animal's feeding trough. If Jesus really is God's own Son, that makes him very special indeed. Perhaps he deserves some more time and space in our own lives?

Questions to explore:
During the day, when do you, or when could you make some time to think about how special Jesus is?

#### ANGELS APPEAR TO THE SHEPHERDS

Luke chapter 2, verses 8-14

#### Reflection:

More angels – lots of them this time! The angels visit a group of shepherds on the hillside at night. No wonder the angels say, 'don't be afraid!' Their message is that a Saviour has been born in the city of David (which is Bethlehem). Another word for 'Saviour' is rescuer – imagine a knight in shining armour! As we look at news headlines and our TV and computer screens, we see all sorts of things from which we might need to be rescued.

#### Questions to explore:

- I. Have you ever been rescued? Where were you? What happened? How did you feel?
- 2. Are there things you need help with or 'rescuing from' today?

You might want to share these things together as a family group, or to hold them in your mind, sharing them only with God.



#### WISE MEN TRAVELLING TO BETHLEHEM

Matthew chapter 2, I-2, 9-11

#### Reflection:

Most Christmas plays include three kings. We don't actually know if they were kings, but we are told they were wise men. We don't even know how many of them there were! Three gifts are mentioned, so we have assumed that there were three wise men. They followed the star and were filled with joy. When they arrived, they bowed down and worshipped the small baby.

Questions to explore:
I. What fills you with feelings of joy?
2. Does it seem odd that theses wise men bowed down and worshipped a baby?
3. Why do you think they did this?

"We three kings"

#### LIGHT IN THE DARKNESS

John chapter I, verses I-5

#### Reflection:

As you look at the final scene from the Christmas story, the baby Jesus in the manger, look at the light and the shadows. Notice that where the light shines down on the scene, there is no darkness. When we switch a light on, or light a candle, the darkness disappears.

In this reading, 'the Word' is one of the Bible's names for Jesus. Read this final scene from our Christmas story again and replace the phrase 'the Word' with 'Jesus.'

Questions to explore:
<ul><li>I. What does this reading tell us about Jesus?</li><li>2. How does this change how we might think about Jesus?</li></ul>
